Karen Root, an advanced registered nurse practitioner, and Laurie Winkelman, a registered nurse, competed in the San Francisco Nike Women's Marathon.

The marathon is a benefit to raise funds for fighting leukemia and lymphoma. They were among 20,000 runners who competed, mostly women but some males.

It was Root's second participation in the race, following participation last year. It was the first marathon for Winkelman.

Winkelman finished the race in four hours, 55 minutes, and Root posted a time of five hours, 45 minutes.

The women, both residents of rural Lyons, were accompanied to San Francisco by their husbands, Lonnie Winkelman and Kyle Root.
